Who should apply to the SOCL?

DISCERNMENT: Anyone who has discerned a desire 'to create time & space for God' for others - who desires to continue intentional journey of discernment to be more open to self, others, and God - who has begun a movement into the second half of life (individuation) - who has begun a working understanding of self/charism/vocation.

DISCIPLINES: Anyone who has written and is practicing a rule of life - meets with a spiritual director - has a healthy and accountable relationship with a spiritual community - has participated in 2-3 retreats - has a working understanding and practice of solitude and silence - has working understanding of communal discipline (able to learn from and love Judas).

BOOKS: Anyone who is familiar with these books from the School of Prayer or similar books: Jesuit Guide to (Almost) Everything, Into the Silent Land, Jesus and the Disinherited, The Cross and the Lynching Tree, Desert Fathers & Mothers: Early Christian Wisdom Sayings.

KNOWLEDGE BASE: Anyone who has a working understanding of these kinds of terms.... spiritual formation, contemplative spirituality, social-justice, ecumenicism, ecclesiology, liturgy, theology, spiritual discipline, bible study, lectio divina, familiar with a variety of spiritual traditions old and new (Ignatian, Desert Wisdom, Eastern, Carmelite, Benedictine, Celtic, Anglo-Catholic, Protestant, Merton, Nouwen, Peterson, Willard, Foster, Rhor, Keating).

- 5. Briefly describe your current practice of prayer and spiritual discipline. (1-2 paragraphs)
- 6. If you could mature in one area of your life, what would that be and why? (1 paragraphs)
- 7. What books or people alive or dead influence you most today and why? (1-2 paragraphs)
- 8. How busy do you live your life? What are the advantages and disadvantages of your life's pace? (1-2 paragraphs)

Application Process:

- 1. Submit your application and two references, one from some form of pastor or spiritual leader and one from someone other than a family member who can speak to your character.
